In 1936, a man named Victor Hugo Green started a travel guide to make life on the road easier and safer for black motorists. The guide listed, state by state, the restaurants, hotels, drug stores, guest houses, taverns, barber shops, service stations, and other businesses that would welcome African-American travelers.

Mr. Green called the book "**The Negro Motorist Green Book**," or "**The Green Book**," for short and its motto was "**Carry your Green Book with you— You may need it.**"
